Described as archetypes, labyrinths are divine imprints found in religious traditions around the world. Unlike a maze with its many choices, entrances, cul-de-sacs and dead ends, a labyrinth instead is a spiritual journey -- offering one path. Inspired by the resurgence of enthusiasm over the past dozen years or so for this ancient tool for meditation and prayer, Danville's reenergized YWCA offers community "pilgrims" an experience patterned after the classic eleven-circuit labyrinth laid into the floor of Chartes Cathedral, near Paris, around 1220. The YW labyrinth, only a bit smaller than the one at Chartes, spans a 36-foot diameter in the YW's Great Room. It was carefully executed in paint under the direction of Outdoor Designs. This Danville-based hardscaping/landscaping firm, owned by Fred and Laura Meder, also has wide experience elsewhere installing labyrinths in traditional unit pavers, not unlike the stone-paved labyrinths of Medieval Europe.

Tour Book 1980:

This striking Romanesque-inspired church has the longest record of use by its congregation of any in the city. A portion of the present structure has been continually occupied since 1867.

The congregation was the first to emanate from Danville's first Methodist church organized on the corner of Wilson and Lynn streets in 1834. By 1865, when that church was experiencing growing pains, plans for a larger house of worship led to a split within the congregation. One group constructed a new church building on Lynn Street in the vicinity of the old one. Others, following the lead of Major William Sutherlin, organized the church now known as Main Street Methodist, the lot on Main Street having been selected and purchased by Major Sutherlin. The precipitous spire of the original Main Street Church, completed in 1873, toppled in a freak wind storm the following year. However, in 1891 the entire 1873 façade was rebuilt in its present Romanesque Revival form by the builder J.R. Pleasants. Distinguished by a castellated tower that makes the church a local landmark visible from almost anywhere downtown, the building exhibits excellent brick details, arched windows, round towers and turrets, all tied together by stone belt courses that make it a superior example of the Romanesque Revival style.

The focal point of the interior, a mural of the Transfiguration, is a notable feature of the sanctuary. As a whole the sanctuary, with its rich woodwork, is exemplary of the best of Victorian craftsmanship. The effect is especially opulent enhanced by the red poinsettias of the Christmas season.

#### Tour Book 1987:

This landmark structure, familiar to most area residents because of its tall, massive castellated tower visible from many points around town, is also allied to the focal point of this year's Tour -- architect J. Bryant Heard. In 1921, Mr. Heard designed for his church its Educational Building. Completed later in the 1920s, the structure has continued for the ensuing six decades as an active and functional part of the life of the congregation.

The original portion of the church, continually occupied since 1867, holds the longest record of use by its congregation of any in the city. This church was the earliest to emerge from Danville's first Methodist church organized on Wilson at Lynn Street in 1834. After the War Between the States, a number of members followed the lead of Maj. William Sutherlin, who purchased the lot where they built and organized Main Street Church. The precipitous spire of the original edifice, completed in 1873, toppled in a freak wind storm the following year. In 1891 the entire 1873 church was overlaid with the present Romanesque Revival facade by the contractor/builder J.R. Pleasants. Excellent brick details, arched windows, round towers and turrets, all tied together by stone belt courses, make this an outstanding example of the Romanesque Revival style.

Built on the site of the former church parsonage, the Education Building that adjoins the church is a superb example of Bryant Heard's adept handling of scale, rhythm, and the relation of new buildings to existing ones. Not a slavish copy or extension of the older, more ornate structure, this annex harmonizes instead because of its straightforward consistency in materials, proportion and repetition of forms -- namely its dark red brick, the tall parapet built in the form of a gable to echo that of the church, and large, semi-circular arched windows on the main floor. Only one decorative device, the small ornamental brick arches near the top of the structure, is copied directly from the 1891 church. The spacious Education Building contains a commodious Fellowship Hall, offices and most of the church's classrooms, except the Peatross Bible Class which meets in the original church sanctuary on the ground floor under the present sanctuary. With its rich woodwork the sanctuary, whose focal point is a mural of the Transfiguration, is an exemplary example of Victorian craftsmanship.

#### Tour Book 2010:

The landmark former Main Street United Methodist Church -- one of a handful of Danville buildings listed individually on the National Register of Historic Places -- now is poised to serve in new capacities as a community resource and preservation center.

This striking Romanesque Revival edifice, which served its congregation and the community from the time charter members founded the church just after the Civil War until it closed in 2007, is being reborn. Today it enjoys a new life of service -- thanks to Danville preservationists, friends and former members of the historic church. Their efforts, in cooperation with the Danville Preservation League, promise to maintain the building for posterity, using it also as a clearinghouse for" best preservation practices," and outreach for preservation throughout the community and well beyond. To that end, in its role as the Preservation Resource Center at MAIN STREET, this landmark is headquarters for a southern Virginia regional satellite of Preservation Virginia (APVA), another strong advocate for historic preservation. The facility is available on a rental basis for weddings, concerts, conferences, and special occasions.

#### Tour Book 2014:

Seven years after it closed, the landmark former Main Street United Methodist Church - one of a handful of Danville buildings listed individually on the National Register of Historic Places - continues its rich legacy as a community resource. Today, thanks to Danville preservationists, friends and former members of the historic church, it enjoys a new life of service under the watch of the not-for-profit Danville Preservation League.

This striking Romanesque Revival edifice, which served its congregation and the community from the time charter members founded the church just after the Civil War until it closed in 2007, is finding new purpose and focus. Currently, two organizations - Preservation Virginia and the Danville Historical Society -- bring day-to-day vitality to space in the ground-level footprint of the original church, dominated by the former Peatross Bible Class.

Preservation Virginia's only satellite office (right here in this Danville landmark) echoes the Richmond headquarters' strong historic preservation ethic, a tradition dating from 1889, making it the nation's oldest statewide preservation effort.

Nearby, the historic Peatross Class, with walnut-paneled walls flanked by stone tablets, honors Methodist men like Judge Richard Warner Peatross, whose names read like a "who's who" of old Danville. It's now the setting for displays of local history and artifacts from the 43-year collection of the Danville Historical Society. These pieces include photographs, postcards, documents, paintings, prints, books and ledgers. A prized rediscovery is a 1798 Danville store ledger, acknowledged as one of Virginia's top-ten threatened treasures by the Virginia Association of Museums. Over the past couple of years DHS volunteers have renewed their focus on this important memorabilia, much of which had languished over time. Countless hours spent reorganizing, accessioning and conserving these items have revived their usefulness for readyaccess and research.

Tour Book 1979:

This year the congregation of the Episcopal Church of the Epiphany is celebrating the 100th anniversary of its present church building. The Danville Historical Society is pleased to share in the special commemoration of this centennial and the 140-year history of the church as Epiphany opens its doors for the 1979 Walking Tour.

A three-level corner tower and octagonal spire, and lancet arch windows and doors alternating between buttressing, are all united in a simple, sturdy design that makes the church one of the city's most significant buildings architecturally. Built by the accomplished Danville architect T. B. Fitzgerald, the stuccoed Gothic Revival structure follows the lines of the original wood church, erected there in 1844, where Confederate president Jefferson Davis worshipped during the final

#### days of the Southern government.

Inside, the serene, mellow appearance of the nave with its unique curved wood ceiling is brightened by the warm glow from old stained-glass windows. Two organs, a 1927 Skinner and a 1979 Andover, are important examples of fine instruments of their respective periods. Throughout the church and parish house are many beautiful memorials: antiques, carpets, and other reminders of the history of the congregation.

#### Tour Book 2002:

A three-level corner tower with octagonal spire, and lancet-arch windows and doors alternating between buttressing, are united in a simple, sturdy design that makes this church one of the city's most outstanding buildings architecturally. Built between 1879 and 1881, the stuccoed Gothic Revival structure follows the lines of the original wood edifice erected here in 1844, a church where Confederate president Jefferson Davis worshipped during the final days of the Civil War.

The present sanctuary is distinguished by an ark-like ceiling of mellow beaded-board, lighted by a number of stained-glass windows attributed to the New York firm of J.& R. Lamb. This is the only church in the area to house two pipe organs -- a 1928 Skinner, and an Andover tracker instrument built and installed in celebration of the 1979 centennial of the historic structure.

He served as a director of Dan River Mills for 24 years, the First National Bank, Westbrook Elevator Company, Danville Traction and Power Company, and as vice president and director of Danville Knitting Mills. ...

On Nov. 6, 1901, he married the former Jennie May Hitchinson of Columbus, Miss., who survives. Also left are one son, William Dudley Overbey of Danville ...

#### 1978 Tour:

Elegant and imposing, the profile of this house is the result of a unique blending of the Italianate and Georgian Revival styles. Architect-builder T. B. Fitzgerald constructed the two-story, red brick Italianate dwelling in 1881 for Robert W. Lawson, a successful tobacconist. After he died in 1884, it was purchased by Sallie E. Shepherd. Mrs. Shepherd, grandmother of W. D. Overbey, lived there until her death in 1904. Mr. and Mrs. Overbey resided in the Main Street house for over a half century thereafter. It was they who in 1911 gave the house a Georgian Revival facelift, adding a two-story semi-circular Ionic portico and a roofline restyled to harmonize. In 1972 the old Overbey home, facing an uncertain future, was purchased and returned to its original beauty by Mr. and Mrs. John DeAlba. Since November of 1977 it has been the home of Mr. and Mrs. William T. Fowlkes, Jr. Their tasteful appointments complement the detailed woodwork, moldings, mantels, and beautiful floors of these spacious rooms.

#### 1989 Holiday Tour:

Elegant and imposing, the profile of this house is the result of a unique blending of Italianate architecture from the early 1880s and the Georgian Revival style from just before the First World War. In his 1971 Inventory, Russell Wright ranked it as one of Danville's EXCELLENT structures architecturally. Architect-builder T.B. Fitzgerald constructed the original two-story, red-brick Italianate dwelling in 1881 for Robert W. Lawson, a successful tobacconist. After he died in 1884, it was purchased by Sallie E. Shepherd, the daughter of early Danvillians Capt. John Noble and Frances Payne Noble, and sister of Mrs. Allen Wyllie, who lived just down the block at 770 Main Street. The widow of Major William E. Shepherd of Fluvanna County, Virginia, Mrs. Shepherd lived here until her death in 1904. One of her grandsons, William Daniel Overbey, also spent much of his boyhood here with his grandmother. After her death, Mr. Overbey and his wife, the former Mae Hutchinson of Mississippi, resided in the Main Street house for over a half century. It was they who in 1911 gave the house a Georgian Revival face-lift, adding a two-story semi-circular portico with cornice and roofline restyled to harmonize. In July of 1972, the house seemed doomed when just hours before the passage of Danville's Historic District ordinance a permit was obtained for the demolition of the structure. A month later however Mrs. Overbey's son sold the property to Mr. and Mrs. John DeAlba, who returned the house to its original beauty. Since November of 1977 it has been the home of Mr. and Mrs. William T. Fowlkes, Jr. Their tasteful antique appointments, as well as accessories collected while Mr. Fowlkes worked in foreign service for the CIA, complement the detailed woodwork, moldings, mantels, and extraordinary parquet floors of the spacious rooms with 13-foot ceilings. Recently, the Fowlkes completed a major renovation of the front porch, which included extensive repair and painstaking reproduction of parts of the massive lonic capitals atop the monumental two-story columns.

#### 1996 Holiday Tour:

Embellished with two-story semi-circular lonic portico and columns in 1911, this alteration tells a story of the prosperity of the third owner, William Daniel Overbey, president of Danville Lumber & Manufacturing Company still in operation today in the Tobacco Warehouse Historic District. The original Italianate dwelling, designed and constructed by T.B. Fitzgerald in 1881, was initially inhabited by R.W. Lawson, tobacconist. Mr. Fitzgerald was Danville's most outstanding architect-builder of the period. Mr. Lawson was a partner with Charles M. Sublett in a tobacco manufacturing firm. In his 1971 inventory of Danville, Russell Wright, architectural historian, ranked it as one of Danville's EXCELLENT structures. This home replaced an earlier home on this site, one of the original lots belonging to Capt. James Lanier, Danville's first mayor, according to land records of 1818.

After Mr. Lawson's death in 1884, Sallie E. Shepherd, daughter of early Danvillians Captain John Noble and Frances Payne Noble, purchased the dwelling and resided there until 1904. One of her grandsons, W. D. Overbey, spent much of his boyhood in the imposing and elegant home and resided here as the third owner for over half a century. In 1972, the house seemed doomed when just hours before the passage of the city's Historic District ordinance, a permit was obtained for the demolition of the structure so a gas station could be built on the site. One month later without exercising the demolition permit, the heirs sold the home to Mr. and Mrs. John DeAlba, who relished restoring the property to its original grandeur. Mr. DeAlba came to Danville from York County, Virginia, where his family was engaged for years in the seafood industry with plans to open a branch here. He and his wife, Doris Larkins of Tennessee, were good custodians of an historic home with the experience gained from restoring his ancestral home at Seaford. Virginia.

In 1977, it became the home of Mr. and Mrs. William T. Fowlkes. Jr., after his service in the CIA. Of course, locals know Martha as the First Lady of Dance which she continues teaching in her studio today. The fabulous parquet floors of the spacious rooms enhance the ambiance of the 13-foot ceilings, detailed moldings and mantels, and unique accessories collected during a life of foreign service. The Fowlkes have provided a new lease on life for the notable portico graced with classical columns and dentil molding; during an entire summer they employed contractors with scaffolding to restore its monumental features. Their dedication has saved an important landmark near the northern entrance to Millionaires Row which attracts hundreds of visitors every year to our city.

#### 2003 Holiday Tour:

The imposing silhouette of this house, with its monumental semicircular portico, makes it unique among the eclectic architectural forms of Millionaires Row. It began more simply as one of about a half-dozen lavish brick Italianate mansions built for local tobacconists and textile industrialists in the 1880s by the contractor T.B. Fitzgerald.

This home for R.W. Lawson was completed in 1881. After he died three years later, it was purchased by a descendant of one of Danville's early families, Sallie E. Shepherd, who lived here until 1904. Thereafter, William Daniel Overbey, one of her grandsons who had spent much of his boyhood here, acquired the property. It was Mr. Overbey and his wife, the former Mae Hutchinson of Mississippi, who in 1911 gave the house a Georgian Revival face-lift, restyling the cornice and roofiine, and adding the semicircular Ionic porch. The Overbeys made this their home for more than 50 years.

In July of 1972, a permit to raze the massive dwelling was obtained just hours before passage of the Historic District ordinance drafted to protect the neighborhood. One month later the demolition permit had not been exercised. Instead, the heirs sold the house to Mr. and Mrs. John DeAlba.

No strangers to old houses, the DeAlbas began a loving five-year stewardship of the property, continued in 1977 and for many years, by Mr. and Mrs. William T. Fowlkes, Jr. In little more than a year since their purchase of the house, recent newcomers to Danville from North Carolina -- Cynthia Castle and Danny Liles -- have refurbished the house not only as their home but also as a bed-and-breakfast inn.

Tour Book 1979:

The design for this house was derived primarily from the details and outline of French Renaissance chateau. A projecting three-story corner tower with a conical roof interrupts the otherwise symmetrical facade that features terracotta bands between the first and second floors. Its attention to detail, and bold, sophisticated appearance are said to reflect the qualities of the man for whom it was built. Even the carriage block at the curb in front of the house bears his mark, the initials "J.M.N." for Col. James Mastin Neal. Excellent workmanship evident inside and out is attributable to contractor James H. Fitzgerald, who constructed Colonel Neal's 31 room house. Colonel Neal, a well-known tobacconist, was the son of Thomas D. Neal who originated the present tobacco auction method known as the "Danville System."

For most of the second decade of this century the Main Street residence was known as the Canada House, an exclusive boarding house owned by Mary H. Canada. A development firm bought the property in 1919, but its plans for the site never materialized. Another tobacconist, W. F. Hurdle, purchased the house for rental property in 1931. In 1949 his widow, Ruth Flippen Hurdle, moved here, where she resided for almost 30 years.

Today the brick mansion is the home of Mr. and Mrs. E. Walter Meetze, Jr. who with their teenage daughter are making the restoration of this richly ornamental house a family project.

A wealth of detail about this structure and the 45 other homes located on Main St. between Ridge St. and Mt. Tour Book 1983:

Elm Court is among only a handful of local houses surviving from Danville's days as a sleepy antebellum village. It is important historically as the home of one of the city's most interesting early citizens, Jacob Davis. A Halifax County native, Davis first appears in Danville records in an 1852 deed book that notes his purchase of one acre on Main Street, lot 44, from Thomas B. Doe. Presently, this lot includes Elm Court; the Dr. Bruce James house next door, built in 1899; the Greek Orthodox Church; and the Episcopal parking lot.

According to local land books, in 1853 Davis, who is believed to have been the town coroner, built a house on this lot. Some ten years later, shortly after the marriage of his daughter, Marie Watkins Davis, to George C. Ayres, Davis conveyed his home to his new son-in-law. A journal of local events kept by Davis from 1855-77, called simply Notebook of Jacob Davis, and on file in the genealogy section of the Danville Public Library, makes mention of this transaction: "Apl., 1863. J. Davis residence M & Jefferson Sts., to G.C. Ayres, \$20,000.00."

Judging from recorded evidence and tradition that comes down to us, it is likely that in 1863 when George Ayres was deeded the property by his father-in-law, he made extensive additions to the original dwelling, said to have been a brick cottage facing Jefferson Avenue. Still visible on the south side of the house is a portion of what is believed to have been this cottage, although it is largely overshadowed by Mr. and Mrs. Ayres' two-story clapboard addition with Italianate details. The most prominent feature in the design is the central projecting hooded gable decorated with sawn-work scrolls.

In 1897 George Ayres suffered financial reverses and his property was acquired by Sarah Rhett, who sold it in 1899. Two owners later, in 1920, Dr. Bruce James purchased the property and converted the home into four apartments, adding the two-level balustraded porches that give it the look of a Mississippi river house. He dubbed the house Elm Court for the lovely elm that then graced the broad front yard. Dr. James' heirs retained the property until 1954, when they sold the house to Mr. and Mrs. James A. Smith. About two years ago, when Mrs. Smith's estate was settled, the house was purchased by Whittington W. Clement. Within the past year Mr. Clement, who lives next door in the old Paxton-Grant house at 815 Main Street, has had Elm Court painted a cheerful yellow.

Two of the original marbleized mantels dating from one of the Ayres' remodelings can be seen in the apartment open for the tour. There also is a beautiful bay window. The curved stairway in the entrance hall also dates from this period.

#### Tour Book 1993:

Among the few antebellum structures still standing in Danville, Elm Court was converted into a fourplex in 1920 after it was purchased by Dr. Bruce James. He named the place Elm Court for the majestic American Elm that shaded the front yard for many years. Rated as 'Excellent' in Russell Wright's 1971 architectural inventory, the current structure resembles a Mississippi River house more than a city dwelling. Built in 1853 by Jacob Davis, a native of Halifax County, the house on lot 44 -- then on the comer on Main at Jefferson -- was conveyed in 1863 to his new son-in-law, George Ayres for \$20,000.

Elm Court started out as an L-shaped brick cottage, extensively remodeled in 1881 by Mr. Ayres, according to local land book records, and still exists inside the current configuration of the property with its later Italianate modifications, including the prominent central projecting hooded gable with intricate sawn-work scrolling. The Notebook of Jacob Davis, 1855-1877, a black bound typewritten copy, can be found today in the genealogy section of the Public Library. Mr. Davis was known for keeping records of births, deaths, real estate transactions, fires, and other tidbits of life in the city. At his death in 1877, he was buried in the Ayres plot with other family members in the Green Hill Cemetery.

George Ayres together with his brother, David, operated a tobacco factory on Bridge Street, which they inherited from their father, William, an early settler in the village of Danville. George served on the Town Council, was the twenty-fifth mayor, and the foreman of the Grand Jury that investigated the Danville Riot.

Suffering from financial problems in 1897, Ayres conveyed the property to Sara Rhett, to satisfy a debt. Subsequently, it was sold to Annie Morris Smith, who later married R.B. Graham, a well-known architect and builder. In 1920, after T.W. Edmunds sold the home to Dr. James, the notable two level balustraded front porches were added in its conversion to four apartments,

After passing through several other owners, the home was purchased by Ed and Bobbie Thompson from Binghamton, New York, in 1987. The Thompsons were attracted to Danville by its quaintness, wealth of historic architecture, and reminiscences of childhood homes. The Thompsons have painted the exterior clapboarding pink with burgundy accents, sanded floors, added a chandelier from an estate in South Boston, installed a ceiling medallion, and refurbished the eight existing faux marble mantels and pocket doors. In their front parlor hangs a 1904 photo of the home given to them by Whittington W. Clement, one of the previous owners.

#### Tour Book 2012:

Elm Court started small -- a brick cottage built on a large corner lot only a few years before the Civil War. By 1920, when a towering American Elm dominated the yard, Elm Court had grown large and lavish like the tree, complete with double porches reminiscent of a Mississippi River steamboat.

Begun originally for Jacob Davis in 1853, the L-shaped cottage occupied a few square feet on a one-acre lot, No. 44, at the corner of Main Street at Jefferson. Besides his modest house, Mr. Davis' other tangible legacy is his Notebook, a journal where, from at least the early-to-mid 1850s until his death in 1877, he recorded local births, deaths, real estate transfers, fires, weather and other phenomena.

In 1863, Mr. Davis conveyed the property to his new son-in-law, George Ayres, for \$20,000 -- a sum reflecting wartime inflation. In 1881 Mr. Ayres, a tobacconist (see also Site #3), remodeled the premises extensively, completely enveloping his father-in-law's old cottage, adding as well a central hooded gable and other Italianate details which survive. Ayres sold the property in 1897 to Sarah Rhett who, two years later, conveyed it to Annie Smith -- who later married R.B. Graham, the prominent Danville architect-contractor. After Dr. Bruce James acquired the house from Dr. T.W. Edmunds in 1920, he retained architect J. Bryant Heard to redesign it as four units.

Over many decades of the 20th century, these spacious apartments were the stylish address of a number of Danville's leading citizens. In more recent years, stewards of this house have included as well some of the city's most valued newcomers. One of these caring owners from a generation ago, Miss Lenice Larkin, was Danville's YWCA director in the early-to-mid 1980s. When that venerable institution at 750 Main Street closed in 2011 -- after 104 years service -- its last director, Carol Ann Lawson, happened also to call Elm Court home. Like her predecessor Miss Larkin, who opened Elm Court for a DHS tour some 30 years ago, Mrs. Lawson graciously followed suit for this, the 40th Annual DHS Tour.

Inside, natural light streams through large windows in high-ceilinged rooms, some of which are graced by faux marble 1880s mantels. Mrs. Lawson, a native of Great Britain, has adorned her apartment with a handsome collection of antiques and appointments respectful of the 19th-century character of this historic residence.

### Tour Book 1980:

The American Picturesque design of this two-story clapboard dwelling also includes a distinctive eyebrow window, and shingled gables and porches, showing the influence of the angular Queen Anne style popular on Main Street, and throughout Danville and America in the 1880s. Early in 1980 the house became the property and residence of Whittington W. Clement, who appreciates and enjoys it now as his home as did its long-time owner who was born here, Dabney Paxton Grant. Her death ended one of the longest associations of one family with a house of any on Main Street.

The land where the house is situated is a portion of a larger Main Street tract owned long before the Civil War by Mrs. Grant's great-grandfather, John W. Paxton, and later deeded to his son William C. Paxton. His homeplace stood on land next door now occupied by the Main Street Methodist parking lot. It was on part of his yard, that his son Walter T. Paxton, Mrs. Grant's father, built the present handsome residence in 1895. Originally the structure is said to have been painted dark red with white trim. The accuracy of this recollection is borne out in a postcard view of the 800 block of Main Street from about 1910 that shows clearly the ruddy late-Victorian color scheme of the house.

Mr. Clement, the present owner, continues to lavish the same care on the house it has received throughout its history, at the same time placing his own stamp on the well-proportioned rooms with their harmonious mantles, moldings, paneling, and stained glass.

Also, open upstairs are the apartments of Bill Hall and Kenneth Smith. They demonstrate well how a beautiful old home can accommodate several living units without compromising or altering the historic integrity of the structure.

### Tour Book 1992:

Rambling dwellings of the 1890s were described frequently in their day as "comfortable houses.-This house built on Danville's gracious Main Street is no exception. Its shingled gables, porches, projecting bays and dormers, influenced by the angular Queen Anne style, all contribute to the cozy feeling of hearth and home dear to the hearts of our late-Victorian ancestors.

Its present owners are only the second family to occupy this notable American Picturesque style dwelling. It was built nearly a century ago for Walter T. Paxton, a successful tobacconist, whose daughter Dabney Paxton Grant continued to live in the house until her death in the late 1970s.

The land where the house is situated actually is a portion of a large Main Street tract acquired in antebellum days by Mrs. Grant's great-grandfather, John W. Paxton, Danville's renowned silversmith and clockmaker of the early 19th century. The homeplace of his son, William C. Paxton, once stood on land next door now occupied by the Main Street Methodist parking lot. It was at the left of this broad lot that his son, Walter, built the present house in 1895. During her life Mrs. Grant maintained that early on the structure had been painted in the earthy red tones

popular just before and after the turn of the century. A postcard view of Main Street's 800 block, c 1910, bears out the accuracy of this recollection. It shows clearly the ruddy late-Victorian color scheme of the house at that time.

Since purchasing the house from the Grant estate in 1980, Mr. Clement, Danville's delegate to the Virginia General Assembly, and his wife have continued the care lavished on the structure during its first 85 years as the Paxton-Grant homeplace. This careful maintenance, complemented by antiques and family heirlooms throughout its well-proportioned rooms, extends also to the handsome backyard and garden. In recent years the Clements have revitalized the rear of the house -- the kitchen and butlers pantry -- combining small rooms into a functional and spacious kitchen that retains much of the fabric of the early house, including the mellow heart pine floors and a plate warmer that was integral to the original gas-fired heating system.

### Tour Book 2000:

A distinctive eyebrow window and shingled gables and porches are hallmarks of the Queen Anne-style dwelling built in 1895 for a successful tobacconist, Walter T. Paxton. Paxton's property is part of a larger Main Street tract acquired in antebellum days by his father, John W. Paxton, a renowned silversmith and clockmaker of the early 19th century.

His daughter, Dabney Paxton Grant, lived here in the old family home her entire life. Since her death some 20 years ago, three young, active families have called 815 Main Street home. These residents include the Danville-area's legislator in Virginia's House of Delegates, Whittington W. Clement, as well as a young neurologist who moved here from England to establish his practice, Dr. Jeffrey Crittenden.

The most recent of these owners, Dr. & Mrs. Dan Cahill, have lived here for just over two years. Like their predecessors, the Cahills and their growing sons appreciate the American Picturesque styling of the exterior, as well as its spacious rooms, with original features like a radiator plate warmer, and updates like the sensitively renovated kitchen with its AGA cooker.

A sports den upstairs features memorabilia of famous baseball, hockey, and basketball athletes.

Its original wooden trim work intact, this Main Street house is immediately identified as the one with the "gingerbread.- Richly ornamental, it exhibits architectural features characteristic of the Eastlake, Queen Anne and Shingle styles. Edward Fox Acree built the complex dwelling in 1881. He and his brother, James, who also lived here, purchased the old Eagle Warehouse on Craghead Street and changed its name to Acree's. When they died early in this century, the Acree brothers headed the Danville Cooperative Warehouse Company. They were considered leaders In Danville's emergence as the world's largest loose leaf tobacco market.

In 1910 Mrs. E. F. Acree and her sons sold the house to P. F. Conway, for many years president of the Danville Lumber and Manufacturing Company. After his death, the house was sold by Mrs. Conway to William Aubrey Terry, in 1949. His widow, the former Eva Chaney Dodson, and his daughter, Miss Nancy Terry, continue to reside there.

A commanding feature of the house is a corner tower rising three stories above the street. Inside, its four stained glass windows illuminate the dark paneling beneath. Pairs of lonic columns at the end of the long entrance hall and in the divided living room lend dignity to the interior. Other classical motifs include a dentil design in the cornices, repeated in the mirrored mantels, and a Greek key pattern bordering the parquet floors.

Tour Book 1984:

A fine restoration completed by the present owners within the past year has returned this dwelling to the elegance of the dawn of the Edwardian era when it was built. Local contractor Henry A. Osborne constructed the house -- a notable combination of the Queen Anne, Shingle and Neo-Classical Revival styles -- for Edward G. Moseley in 1902. Among the last of the influential Danvillians to move to Main Street during its original heyday, Moseley rose to prominence locally as a tobacco manufacturer and leaf dealer, and as president of the Danville Tobacco Association. Also, as a lay leader in Main Street Methodist Church, Moseley began a mission in a Cabell Street home that under his leadership grew spiritually and numerically into Cabell Street Church. This congregation later built the present handsome Tudor Gothic structure on Berryman Avenue at Colquhoun Street -- the church subsequently renamed Moseley Memorial after its founder died in 1930.

In 1938, Moseley's widow sold the house to a relative, Mary Moseley Ley. Nearly six years later the house was conveyed to George Wesley Terry and Delphia Herndon Terry. After Mr. Terry's death in 1949, Mrs. Terry married Dr. R.W. Garnett, director of Danville's Health Department for 30 years. With his wife Dr. Garnett lived here until 1976 when he died at age 95. After Mrs. Garnett's death in April 1982, the house was purchased by Charles Staubus and Ray Harris.

Making very few interior changes, the owners have made the house eminently functional with a contemporary kitchen and baths. At the same time they have retained and renewed original features elsewhere in the house -- parquet floors, mantels, moldings and fine stained glass -- to

name a few. A subtle, mostly neutral color scheme is an effective foil for the owners' collection of antiques, oriental rugs and local art. For the holiday season a unique collection of Christmas ornaments will also be on display.

#### Tour Book 1993:

Built in 1902, with a notable combination of styles from the Queen Anne, Shingle, and Neoclassical revivals, this house was purchased by Charles R. Staubus, its third owner, in 1983. The original owner, E.G. Moseley, was a tobacconist who served as President of the Danville Tobacco Association. This beloved minister, for whom Moseley Memorial Methodist Church was named, also was among the last influential Danvillians to move to Main Street during its heyday. Local contractor, Henry A. Osborne, built this home at the dawn of the Edwardian era.

In 1938, Moseley's widow sold the home to a relative, Mary Moseley Ley, who lived here six years before conveying the property to George Wesley Terry and his wife, Delphia Herndon. After Mr. Terry's death in 1949, Mrs. Terry married Dr. R.W. Garnett, Director of Danville's Health Department for 30 years.

The formal entrance foyer, parlor, and dining room feature elegant parquet flooring, which is still in excellent condition, and creates an inviting floor plan for entertaining. The crystal chandelier, Italian tile, and two stained glass windows lend a warm ambience to the formal parlor. The four-foot-high wainscot with plate rail frames the setting for formal dining under a second crystal chandelier. The library lined with a handsome collection of books features an 1842 Charles Steiff square concert grand pianoforte. Mr. Staubus has collected unusual antiques, oriental rugs, and over 100 works by artist Carson Davenport, some of which are on displayed.

On view for the holidays will be five Christmas trees: a Scandinavian tree with a bird motif; a tree featuring gold, silver and crystal ornaments; a gingerbread tree in the kitchen; a Victorian tree with ribbon, popcorn, and cranberries; and in the entrance foyer, a tree with 6,000 ornaments from travels around the world.

In his extensive restoration to the exterior, Mr. Staubus plans a seven-color paint scheme with a muted Victorian blue for the clapboard, eggshell white for windows, cranberry for the ribbing elements, three shades of pink for the shake-shingle gables, with navy accents for the front medallion. The rear garden is magnificent in the spring with its brick walk and plantings of fig, hyacinths, daffodils, peonies, narcissus, and a vast array of iris.

#### Tour Book 2005:

After languishing for some years, this Queen Anne style house with decided Shingle and Neo-Classical Revival influence has been resurrected in less than two years. In January 2004, Sarah and Dan Latham purchased the sagging structure and soon began the herculean task of its rehabilitation.

This impressive dwelling, built in 1902/03 for Mr. E.G. Moseley, now sports a rich palette of late Victorian earth tones. Supporting that new curb appeal are lots of new bones -- foundation, roof, and much of its framing -- which the Lathams renewed and reinforced long before they

applied the striking cosmetic touches that help the house reclaim its place of honor on Millionaires Row.

The original owner, E.G. Moseley, was a tobacconist who served as president of the Danville Tobacco Association. This beloved minister, for whom Moseley Memorial Methodist Church was named, also was among the last influential Danvillians to move to Main Street during its heyday. Local contractor Henry A. Osborne built the Moseley House at the dawn of the Edwardian Era.

In 1938, the Rev. Moseley's widow sold her home to a relative, Mary Moseley Ley, who lived here six years before conveying the property to George Wesley Terry and his wife, the former Delphia Herndon. After Mr. Terry's death in 1949, Mrs. Terry married Dr. R.W. Garnett, the City's chief health officer for some 30 years.

In 1983, the house was purchased by only its fourth owner in as many generations, Mr. Charles Staubus. Mr. Staubus, a local hairdresser, worked for many years to stabilize the property, restoring many of its principal rooms. Failing health curtailed his planned exterior restoration, and the property remained in limbo for several years.

The house and community were blessed by the arrival of Sarah and Dan Latham -- from a city known for its preservation ethic, Annapolis, Maryland. In lavishing their enthusiasm and means on the historic E.G. Moseley House, the Lathams also have demonstrated the transformation possible with tenacity and know-how.

Dr. Henry A. Wiseman, Jr., completed this stuccoed, English-cottage-style house for his bride on the eve of the First World War. The row of large boxwood bordering the front yard actually leads to the site of an earlier family home -- built in 1870 -- where Dr. Wiseman was born, and which stood somewhat behind the setback of the present house. In fact, three successive generations named Henry A. Wiseman -- each associated with the medical profession -- lived either in the earlier or the present house on the property, which once comprised an acre. That acreage was reduced substantially after 1901, when the elder Wiseman sold the right side yard for Mr. E.G. Moseley to build his house at 840 Main which, judging from old maps, virtually hugged the old Wiseman homeplace.

Following a century of ownership by the Wiseman family -- from 1869 to 1969 in two successive houses -- the property served as headquarters for the Danville-area chapter of the American Red Cross for over three decades. In 2002, the house began its long journey back from years of institutional use when the first owner-occupants in many years, Pam Gray and Mike Sampson -- both skilled at old house rejuvenation -- turned their attention to this diamond in the rough and reclaimed it for their home.

The next, and current, owners have continued the transformation, working to recapture the charm of the old Wiseman house, built from plans by the architect J. Bryant Heard. Since their 2006 relocation to Danville for Mr. Holloway's job with LunaNanoWorks, the couple have rehung shutters original to the windows on a newly-repainted, cheerful facade. Inside, they are fine-tuning the renovation initiated five years ago, adding their personal stamp to the 90-year-old Wiseman house.

With preservation in their bloodlines, Dr. Starr and his wife, Kelly, found their way to River City to join the Neurology Clinic of Dr. Jeff Crittenden and family who are busy finishing the restoration of the Paxton House at 815 Main Street for the Spring 1997 Garden Tour. The William H. Lipscomb home at 854 Main Street had been rescued recently from years as a medical office by local attorney, Brian Turpin, and family, who needed more bedrooms with the birth of their third child, and decided to sell about the time of the Starrs' arrival.

As a result of an 1883 chancery suit presided over by Harry Wooding, Special Commissioner, this eighty-foot lot was sold by R. W. Hobson for \$4,350 to devoted brothers and business partners, James E. and W.H. Lipscomb, to be divided and shared for the construction of their mirror image homes in 1885. The existing driveway divided the lot between the long facing porches of each

dwelling. When James died in 1902, his property was sold to his wealthy neighbor to the south, James Gabriel Penn, and second wife, Sallie. This twin dwelling was demolished and the brick reused to build the carriage house and servant quarters on tour today at 862 Main Street.

The Lipscomb brothers operated a successful grocery and general merchandise business at the bottom of Main Street near its intersection with Bridge. In such a prime location near the Riverside Cotton Mills and the tobacco warehouses, the Lipscombs surely profited handsomely from the burgeoning local economy. Migrating from Pittsylvania County with his parents, William - one of twelve children - served in the Confederate Army's Danville Grays, Company B, 18th Virginia Regiment. He married Mary Augusta North, who died in 1938. The home was left to their daughter, Ethel. who married Willis Tredway Gravely. While residing there, Mr. Gravely operated the firm of Gravely Brothers, an insurance, real estate, and banking concern. With his brother, W. Tredway, he co-founded Union Mutual Building and Loan Association, later known as First Federal. His obituary related that he was a member of the Danville Philosopher's Club when spirited discussions emanated from the late Alonza Traylor, Arthur Taylor, and Harry Ficklen.

In the 1950s, their son, Fenton North Gravely, and family moved back to his childhood home to be with his mother, making the fourth generation of the same family in a span of over seventyseven years to occupy the home. In 1962, the property was sold to Dr. and Mrs. M. Howell Watson who resided upstairs over the office of his ophthalmology practice. When the Turpins arrived on the scene, the now-spacious kitchen was created from small rooms with lowered ceilings into a state-of-the-art culinary delight, especially with the addition of the French doors and a deck. Of special note in the formal parlor, the egg and dart crown molding enhances the decorative style.

#### Tour Book 2002:

In the heady days of Danville's tobacco boom, business partners and devoted brothers James and William Lipscomb had brick "townhouses" built side by side, each nearly the mirror image of the other. James' house was razed just after the turn of the 20th century for the expansion of James G. Penn's mansion and carriage drive next door. William's house survives at 854 Main Street. Built in 1885, it shows Italian and French Renaissance influence, with a Gothic window added for good measure. A rich bracketed cornice and colored slates on the octagonal roof complete its well-developed architectural character.

Members of the Lipscomb and Gravely families -- related by marriage -- continued to reside here for many years, followed by Dr. and Mrs. M. Howell Watson. Since 1993, a series of young couples has renovated the house in succession, most recently Chris and Priscilla Okay. Since moving to Danville from Washington, D.C., only two years ago, the Okays have lavished considerable attention, inside and out, on the proud structure, as well as its rear garden.

Tour Book 1996:

According to architectural historian, Russell Wright the American Picturesque home at 855 Main Street is uniquely detailed, which has become evident again with the restoration painting this year by its new residents.

The circular pavilion porch, bracketed cornice, and elaborate window heads now draw the attention of the touring pedestrian when just months ago the home was neglected and deteriorated from its life as a medical office.

Having faced the threat of demolition several times since it was built in 1878, the home of William L. Fernald, local IRS collector, had a checkered past after the early death of its first owner in 1885. Fernald's widow, Julia Alberta Gravely, came from Henry County where her father headed the successful tobacco manufacturing firm of B.F. Gravely & Sons. Suffering extreme financial difficulties, she mortgaged the home to her brother and returned to Henry County until her death in 1939. In 1904, Montgomery Adkins Allen and his wife, Martha Isabelle Thompson, purchased the home for \$4,000. Mr. Allen moved here from Reidsville, N.C., where he served as mayor while working as a tobacco buyer for American Tobacco Company and later Export Tobacco Company.

Their only child, Ima Allen, married Edward Bickford Young who had relocated to Danville from Rochester, N.Y., with his parents. Mr. Young, a local tobacconist, formed a partnership with Emmett McGee in the Reliance Tobacco Company and Reliance Storage Company in a brick warehouse still standing below DIMON, Inc.'s headquarters on the corner of Bridge and Colquohoun Streets. The young couple resided here with her parents until they moved to 911 Main Street which later was demolished for the educational building of First Presbyterian Church.

In 193I, Emma Throckmorton purchased the property for \$6,500, but never moved from her home on Broad Street. During her twenty-one years of ownership, the home was rental property. In 1952, the home was sold to local real estate salesman, Henry Hobson Gordon, and his wife, Virginia Mann, who resided here for twelve years and converted the basement to apartments. In 1964, William L. Miller and Fred B. Leggett, Jr., purchased this home and an adjacent property, which was demolished, with plans to build an apartment complex or office building. Blocked by neighborhood opposition, the project never materialized. In 1975, its proximity to a project proposed on Pine Street, a high-rise apartment complex to house elderly and handi- capped residents, again threatened demolition. Preservation-minded neighbors again rose in protest and this project was built instead as Holiday Village on Riverside Drive.

Purchased in 1996 by Dr. and Mrs. Darrell Beverly for their son and his family, the future portends a hopeful life for this charming Victorian home, which is open for tour as a "restoration in progress".

Tour Book 1978:

Boldly formed and lavishly detailed, the James G. Penn House exemplifies the eclectic taste of prosperous Danvillians in the last quarter of the 19th century. In October 1978 It was selected as a Virginia Historic Landmark and has been nominated to the National Register of Historic Places. According to the state landmarks commission the house gains importance from its "especially significant and varied interior and a notable facade that combines Second Empire monumentality and Italianate detailing."

James Gabriel Penn, a tobacco-commission merchant and a partner in the highly successful Pemberton and Penn, Inc., built the house in 1876, only eight years after he settled in Danville. He and his second wife, Sallie Johnson Penn, had it remodeled several times between 1887 and 1903. In 1934 Landon R. Wyatt, especially remembered for his service in the state senate, purchased the house and most of its furnishings. Some of these same pieces were in turn sold to Dr. Allan A. Hoffman when he bought the house from the Wyatt heirs In May of 1977. The keen appreciation of Dr. and Mrs. Hoffman for their landmark residence is also evident in the well-maintained carriage house, currently the home of Mr. and Mrs. W. S. Norman, Jr., and the garden where perennials typical of the Victorian era have been planted.

### Tour Book 1990:

The individual character of this mansion on Main Street draws its architectural significance from creative design and quality craftsmanship. Its contribution to the community includes the stories of the Penns and Wyatts, who resided here during its first hundred years.

The curved cast-iron lintels over the windows, the patterned and colored slate roof, and the three-and-a-half story central tower with its mansard roofline attract the attention of visitors to Millionaires' Row. Although the identity of its architect and contractor are unknown, it is among four Danville buildings listed on the State and National registers. The lonic columns on the Neo-Classical front porch and the two-level circular pavilion at the corner are impressive additions to the home built in 1876. James Gabriel Penn started to make these changes to the exterior of the home in 1885, the year he married his second wife. In 1903, he demolished the J. E. Lipscomb home next door and used the brick to build a carriage house and servants quarters. Before coming to Danville in 1868 from his native Patrick County, Penn fought in the Battle of New Market as a cadet at the Virginia Military Institute. After abandoning law and banking, Penn pursued tobacco manufacturing in the partnership of Pemberton and Penn, Inc., which carried him to many lucrative foreign markets.

Penn's second wife, Sallie Johnson of Madison, Georgia, adds to the local folklore with her lavish entertainment, exquisite dress, and daily carriage rides through the city. She was the organizing regent of the Dorothea Henry Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution, which she founded in this home. Overwhelmed by profligate spending and declining stocks, she lost the home in a public auction to Landon R. Wyatt, Sr., in 1934. An accomplished businessman and politician, Wyatt served on Danville's City Council and spent many years in the State Senate. Some of the Penn furnishings, which were bought by the Wyatts, remain in the home.

The elegance of the interior is enhanced by the marble mantels, parquet flooring, and the stained and leaded glass windows and doors. The Wyatt heirs sold the home in 1977 to Dr. Allan A. Hoffman. The high ceilings and spacious rooms create a splendid gallery for Dr. Hoffman's collection of art and passion for photography.

### Tour Book 1994:

Opulence reigns in the extravagant architecture of this Danville landmark -- its bold, Italianate Empire style central tower, complete with circular two-story pavilion porch, and Neo-Classical Revival front porch. Its lavish interior is marked by painstaking attention to detail equal to that outside.

The formal parlors, dining room, library, study and first floor bedroom are exquisite with details such as birdseye maple trim, marble mantels, a hand-painted overmantel mirror, carved foyer trim and elaborate statuary lamps on the newel posts. Stained and leaded glass windows, pocket and exterior doors are of exceptional quality. Intricate parquet flooring and elaborate original chandeliers are sumptuous as well.

Built in 1876 for James Gabriel Penn of Patrick County, and remodeled in the late 1880s under the influence of his second wife, the former Sallie Johnson of Madison, Georgia, the house gave birth to the Dorothea Henry Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution. Penn formed the tobacco merchant firm Pemberton and Penn in 1872 after abandoning law and banking.

In the economic turmoil of the 1930s, the Penn home was sold at public auction to Landon R. Wyatt, Sr., a local automobile dealer whose political career ranged from City Council the the Virginia State Senate. In the late 1970s, Dr. Allan A. Hoffman purchased the mansion with a number of the original Penn family furnishings which remain to this day.

### Tour Book 2012:

With origins coinciding with America's centennial year, 1876, this "house that tobacco built" continued to evolve over the next quarter century as the home of James Gabriel Penn, a native of Penn's Store in Patrick County. It blossomed especially in the late 1880s -- under the watch of Penn's second wife, the former Sallie Johnson of Madison, Georgia. Renowned for her lavish entertainment, exquisite dress, and daily turns in her carriage, Mrs. Penn also organized in this house the Dorothea Henry Chapter, DAR. Her husband, a former VMI cadet who served in the Battle of New Market, hailed from a Patrick County, Virginia, tobacco family. After the Civil War he came to Danville -- first trying law and banking -- before making his name and fortune relying on the commodity, tobacco, he knew well as a partner in the international leaf dealership he helped establish, Pemberton & Penn.

A bold, Italianate exterior, punctuated by a three-story Second Empire central tower, exudes the robust opulence of Danville's tobacco wealth. Its Neo-Classical Revival front porch terminates in a circular two-story pavilion. The interior is equally lavish. Formal parlors, dining room, library, and the first floor bedroom are adorned either with molded grain-painted wood, or hardwoods such as oak or birdseye maple. Elegant mantels are faux marble, including one with a hand-painted overmantel mirror. Stained and leaded glass pocket doors, and exterior doors and windows, are of exceptional quality, set off with intricate parquet flooring.

The Great Depression of the 1930s forced the sale of Mrs. Penn's house. A local automobile dealer, Landon R. Wyatt (Sr.), whose political career took him from Danville's City Council to the Virginia State Senate, purchased the property at auction in 1934. Following the long tenure of the Penns and the Wyatts, whose stewardship spanned a century, the house sheltered a succession of physicians and their families, beginning with Dr. Allan Hoffman III the late 1970s. From 1995 to 2011, it was home to Dr. and Mrs. Max Levine and their four children.

In May 2012, Peggy Parrish became the property's fifth owner in 135 years. Mrs. Parrish had stumbled upon the mansion while visiting Danville with a friend who was shopping for houses. No stranger to historic preservation, this university professor and old-house aficionado relocated here from Richmond, where she restored more than one venerable old landmark.

Tour Book 1984:

Throughout 1984 the congregation of First Baptist Church has been observing its 150th anniversary or Third Jubilee, a reference to the Old Testament (Leviticus) Jubilee -- the 50th year -- in which liberty was proclaimed throughout the land. With this tour the Danville Historical Society is pleased to highlight the history of this venerable church.

Established on June 28, 1834, First Baptist was the second denomination to organize a church locally. Beginning with 25 members in a building on Craghead Street, the church then moved to the corner of Patton and Ridge street across from where the Baptist- supported Union Female College (now Averett) was founded in 1859. These sites, once known together as Baptist Hill, are now occupied respectively by First Virginia Bank, South, and Biscuitville.

Following the Civil War, the congregation and the town grew so much that the members purchased a lot on Main Street where the present church was begun in 1882. A local contractor, J.R. Pleasants, and brick manufacturer, John T. Watson, completed the work on the edifice, dedicated in 1885.

In 1905 a springtime electrical storm started a fire that gutted the interior, leaving only the walls intact. Temple Beth Sholom and Roanoke College (Averett) served as meeting places for the congregation until restoration and improvements to the church were completed by builders Deitrick and Pearson. Notable features added at this time included the handsome stained-glass windows and the sturdy pews, guaranteed for fifteen years and still in use.

An outstanding building architecturally, First Baptist Church is a fine brick Gothic Revival structure consisting of gable ends facing both Main and Chestnut streets. A square tower at the corner rises to meet the slender octagonal spire, like Mt. Vernon Methodist Church. First Baptist features a variety of geometrical shapes molded into a compact harmonious whole.

### Tour Book 2004:

Just above Penn's Bottom, a soaring steeple lifts every eye heavenward above the mansions of Millionaires Row. Some 120 years ago, this precipitous spire topped off the massive edifice of red brick open to visitors during the afternoon. Today, members of First Baptist Church remain faithful to their spiritual predecessors who organized this congregation, one of the city's "first" churches, in 1834.

Organized temporarily on Craghead Street, the church soon moved to its first permanent home on the corner of Patton Street at Ridge, a knoll which came to be known as "Baptist Hill" after 1859, when the Baptist-supported school now known as Averett University located on the opposite corner, the present site of Biscuitville.

Nearly a half century after its founding, the congregation -- by then too large for its Patton Street facilities -- chose the site of its present church, a lot valued at \$8,000, fronting 100 feet on Main Street as it intersects with Chestnut Street. For \$32,500 the local builder J.R. Pleasants constructed the massive brick High Victorian Gothic edifice, with thousands of bricks provided by John T. Watson, also of Danville.

The design, however, appears to have come from an architect of national reputation, John Rochester Thomas, of Rochester, New York. Both the First Baptist Church of Danville, completed in 1885, and Lynchburg's First Baptist, completed in 1886, appear nearly identical to an illustration of the day showing a church by Thomas in Auburn, New York.

The church grew and prospered until lightning struck the building during a severe storm in May of 1905 resulting in a fire which left only the walls, tower, and part of the steeple standing. During reconstruction, Temple Beth Sholom and Roanoke College (Averett) served as meeting places for the congregation.

Following plans of a Greensboro (NC) architect, the builders Deitrick and Pearson of Danville reconstructed the church with form and details which survive to this day adding the present stained-glass windows and oak pews -- now nearly a century old. The addition of more spacious

educational facilities date from the 1930s and 1960s. The Moller organ in the sanctuary dates from a refurbishing of that space in 1947.

Tour Book 1983:

This architectural fantasy built for a young bride by her husband in 1874 is recognized today as an outstanding and rare example of a fully-developed High Victorian Gothic style mansion. Rich Gothic details such as the pointed arched windows, corbeled cornices, finials, and corner engaged columns, serve to emphasize the complex but controlled Medieval-type massing. Dominating the composition is a three-and-a-half-story central tower terminating in a wedgelike Chateauesque roof with iron cresting.

The lacy iron work of the porches with their curved mansard roofs is thought to be a product of the famed Richmond foundry, Tredegar.

Although Charles M. Sublett came to Danville from his native Lynchburg in 1858 at the age of 23, it was after his postwar return from Confederate service and his marriage to Jennie E. Cosby in 1866 that he achieved the status of a well-to-do local businessman. Despite ill health brought

on by the war's hardships, he prospered in the hardware partnership of Hickey & Sublett and later with R.W. Lawson & Co., tobacco manufacturers, where he worked at the time of his death in 1876. His widow, Jennie, the daughter of one of Danville's most prominent early families, was remarried in 1878 to a native of Franklin, Massachusetts -- Edward Howe Miller. Several years after their marriage, in 1885, a local tile and plaster contractor, Charles Orchard, supervised extensive improvements to the dwelling, enlarging the house from its original square shape, shown on Beers' 1877 Map of Danville.

Miller had come to Danville in 1877. The 1881 city directory lists him as a dealer in china, greenware, glass, stoves and tinware at 79 Main Street, a business probably much like his earlier Illinois hardware operation wiped out a decade earlier in the Great Chicago Fire. His grandson and namesake has a jug bearing the name "E.H. Miller.- Later Miller became a co-proprietor with Graveley & Miller, tobacco manufacturers.

His son, Dr. E. Howe Miller, Jr., converted the house to an office/ residence combination to begin his medical practice here just prior to World War I, and during that conflict he rendered invaluable service as chief surgeon at the University of Virginia's base hospital in France.

The son of Dr. Miller and his wife, the former Elizabeth Noell, is the third E. Howe Miller to reside here. He and his wife, the former Louise Wetterstrom of Oregon, have devoted a great deal of attention to the preservation of the house, enhancing its livability while retaining its architectural integrity.

### Tour Book 2000:

After 125 years in the same family, the Sublett-Miller House was purchased at an estate auction in April 2000, by Tom and Carla Belles. Attracted by an advertisement in the National Trust's magazine Preservation, the couple from Falls Church, Virginia, placed the high bid for this High Victorian Gothic-style brick mansion with pointed arched windows and lacy cast-iron porches.

Currently, they are engaged in an ambitious restoration of the property, carefully refurbishing original features of the mansion from its earliest days in 1874, when Charles M. Sublett built this architectural fantasy as a dream house for his bride, the former Jennie Cosby.

The new owners also are preserving and enhancing the house's early additions and embellishments, many dating from the 1880s, about a decade after Mr. Sublett had died, and his widow, Jennie, married E. Howe Miller. Their son, and then their grandson, lived here for most of the 20th century, the latter until his death in 1997.
